With our Hurricane Season upon us, lightning events, and prolonged outages, costly damage that these lightning storms can inflict is very frustrating and easily life-threatening. So, in the interest of not getting frustrated, I will be disconnecting the Echolink reflector when lightning hits come within six miles of my location. To support that practice I have installed sensor apparatus that monitors direction, range, intensity, and the number of lightning events taking place. There may be some Echolink service disruption as a result.

ARRL Awards

Just when you think the bands are dead, W4AII, club vice president Jim Nelson earns two ARRL Awards, Jim finally recaptured his youth by getting his WAS



and WAC awards for the second time. The first ones were using CW in 1965, mostly on 15 meters. He got these new awards in just 3 months of ft8 operation, mostly on 17 meters, in

a small restricted condo. He had to use a southeast(!) facing 24 foot end fed random wire antenna strung along his balcony wall. He also has almost 70 DX coun-

tries so far towards his DXCC. His old 125 countries worked QSL cards from 1965 intended for his DXCC application were accidently trashed when he left



for college! With these awards in the bag, Jim is now working on **DX-100**, and I'm sure he will achieve it soon. Jim thanks the more than 10 EARS club members who selflessly helped him with ft8 on his icom 7100 and the antenna.

Ft. Laramie POTA

Our club member Bill Reid, **K7WWR**, temporarily out of town on a project reports on his recent PO-TA adventure: "Greetings from **Wyoming**. I finally got time to set up the OCFD from Park K-6114 which is Oregon Trail Ruts and is a National Historic Site. I ran my usual rig of batteries and the FT-897D.

I operated from 1600 to 1800 UTC and had 59 QSO's from all over the US and 2 Countries. It was a fun adventure and one I think we should seriously consider doing as a Club. We could have several operators running for an 8 hour day and I am sure we could log 200 calls in a day. I had sixty in less than 2 hours so this seems reachable.

I plan to operate next Saturday Morning from the Historic Fort Laramie Wyoming Site to see how that ages. Park number K-0817.

I had pile ups which was fun and am looking forward to hearing from some of you while I am operating. I had several from Florida and they were 55-59. However the band was good all the way from Vt, Canada, Mexico, Washington State California, Texas. It didn't matter. Even had a guy locally from 2 miles away ground planeing me and hurt my ears, Ha Ha.

A lady came up to me and asked if I was doing Ham Radio as she, her husband and sons are hams from Colorado. She took pictures and said her dad would be jealous of me operating in a park. Yesterday I operated from the Campground I am in and had RW1F, Several from Germany, Italy and Croatia. Band was noisy but the signals were strong. If I have time I am going to try to operate from Register Cliff Historic Site which is where the settlers carved their names and dates in a sandstone cliff. Most of the names are still visible today."
